Using the Library Catalog to find books and Websites

Go to library.sd36.bc.ca and click on **North Surrey Secondary**
 Click on **Catalog** and in the search box type your subject, click on **Subject**
 The books held by the library on that subject will be listed

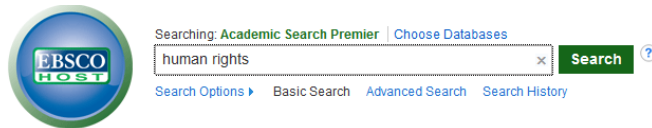

In the search box type your subject. Make sure the *Full Text* box is checked on the left. It is important that you use the right terms. Sometimes a bit of experimenting is required. You will get literally thousands of articles, from a variety of sources such as magazines and newspapers.
